- Q Would you please provide a cost estimate/budget and current plan holder list for the subject solicitation? In addition, what is the construction timeline including start and end dates?
  A A cost estimate/budget is not being publicly released for this project and no official plan holders list exists. The construction timeline includes construction beginning as soon as possible beginning in May 2025. Playground and other equipment will be delivered to the site in April. Substantial completion is set to be September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2025 and final completion is set as September 26<sup>th</sup> 2025.
- 3. **Q** I am checking in on this project to confirm the bid date remains unchanged. **A** The bid due date is unchanged. It remains Thursday, February 6<sup>th</sup>. Bids can be emailed as detailed in the bid documents.

### **Project Summary:**

- 1. In fall 2024, a previous phase to this project included purchase and delivery for all playground equipment and site furnishings needed to construct the replacement playground referred to as Fantasy Forest 2.0 at St. Johns City Park in St. Johns Michigan. Great Lakes Recreation was the successful bidder on this work and will be a key partner for this current phase of the Fantasy Forest 2.0 Playground Installation and Site Work project.
- 2. This Project, known as Fantasy Forest Playground Improvements, includes, but is not limited to the installation of playground equipment, benches, litter bins, and a water fountain purchased as part of a separate project. The project also includes grading and drainage, connecting concrete paths and other improvements. Proposed landscape plantings will be purchased but not installed in this project; installation will follow as part of a community work day.

Work will also include site restoration and other Work necessary to complete the project. Significant coordination will be required during this project between Contractor, City of St. Johns staff, representatives from Great Lakes Recreation, representatives of ESM, lighting and electrical contractor, and asphalt installer. Coordination efforts will be provided by Contractor incidental to the project.

The site is located on the west side of St. Johns Park Rd, inside St. Johns City Park in the City of St. Johns, Michigan, as shown on the Drawings. # **Contract Requirements:**

- 1. Bidder's Qualifications (Section 002113, Article 1.02)): Indicates information regarding bidder's qualifications to perform the work must be submitted after Owner request.
- 2. Examination of Site (Section 002113, Article 1.02): Bidders should familiarize themselves with the site and the laws and regulations that may affect cost, progress, performance, or furnishing of the Work.
- 3. Bid Security (Section 002113, Article 1.06): 5% of the Bidder's maximum price in the form of a Bid Bond or Cashier's Check. If the Successful Bidder fails to execute and deliver the Contract Documents and to furnish the required Contract security within twenty (20) days after the Notice of Award, Owner may annul and cancel the Notice of Award, and the Bid security of that Bidder shall be forfeited and retained by the City of St. Johns.
- 4. Substitutions (Section 002113, Article 1.08):
  - a. The Contract, if awarded, will be on the basis of materials and equipment proposed to execute the design described in the Plans or specified in the Specifications to substantially match in layout and in theme the enclosed Master Plan. A detailed list of equipment required to build the playground design as-submitted in the Master Plan Bid will be provided by Contractor in the completed Proposal form in Section 00 42 43.
  - b. Contractor is welcome to submit Bids reflecting alternate layouts and themes for the consideration of award as an alternate bid proposal. In such a case, Contractor will provide an additional completed Proposal form in Section 00 42 43 showing a detailed list of equipment required to build the alternative playground design.
  - c. Acceptance of substitute or an "or equal" item of material is at the sole discretion of the Owner or designated Representative.
- 5. Basis of Bid (Section 00200, Article 13):
  - a. The Bid price shall include such amounts as Bidder deems proper for overhead and profit on account of cash allowances, if any, named in the Contract Documents. Refer also to Article 11.07.C for calculation of overhead and profit allowed by the General Conditions.

- b. Bidder shall satisfy themself of the accuracy of the estimated quantities in the Bid by examination of the Site and a review of the Drawings and Specifications, including the Addenda.
- c. Unit Prices bid, shall include such amounts as the Bidder deems proper for overhead, profit, taxes, General Conditions and such other incidentals as noted in the Contact Documents.
- d. The City of St. Johns may increase or decrease the contract quantities in the amount of not more than twenty-five percent (25%) of each item on a Unit Price Work contract without an increase in unit price.
- 6. Contract Time (Section 005200, Article 1.03): Work will be substantially completed by September 12, 2025 and final completion will occur by September 26, 2025.
  - a. The City of St. Johns hosts the annual Mint Festival in early August. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to keep the project site secure during the duration of the festival.
- 7. Insurance Requirements (as specified in General Conditions Article 5): Sample Certificate for Liability Insurance, including minimum insurance limits.
- 8. Contractor's Application for Payment (Section 01 3300 Article 1.05): Contractor shall submit a completed Payment Schedule with an executed Contractor's Application for Payment and Contractor's Declaration to Engineer not more often than once per month. Engineer will certify payments with the use of Engineer's Certificate for Payment.
  - a. Payment Procedures (Section 00 5200 Article 1.05): The first progress payment under this contract may be requested after the equipment has been ordered by the Contractor. At this time, 50% of the total contract price can be requested for payment. The remaining balance of payment can be requested by the Contractor upon materials delivery.

#### Alternates, Allowances & Unit Prices:

- 1. This project includes the base bid playground as shown on sheet C-2.0 of the construction plans. Additionally, there are additive alternatives 1, 2, and 3 as shown on the same sheet.
- 2. There are two allowances in this bid.
  - a. Construction Staking: Construction Staking will be provided as an allowance to be paid to the Owner's Representative at their actual invoiced cost. This payment shall constitute compensation for the labor, materials, and equipment required for a licensed Professional Surveyor to perform surveying activities in accordance with industry standards. An allowance of \$25,000 has been established for the Contractor to coordinate the project staking with the Engineer.
  - b. Contingency, 5% of Project Cost, to cover costs to unforeseen work which may arise during the course of construction and will only be used at the Owner's direction. This allowance is for unforeseen work which may arise during the course of construction and will only be used at the Owner's direction.


MODEL 10145 DRINKING


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


